

North Dakota Association of Gifted Children (NDAGC) prohibits unlawful discrimination internally (in its administrative and program operations) and externally (in provision of services or advocacy) on the basis of race, political orientation, religion, gender, sexual orientation, age, national origin, ethnicity, ancestry, marital status, veteran status, or mental or physical disability or any other status prohibited by applicable law.
